Joining ALA as an MLIS student at UCLA, Lessa is a 14-year dedicated member committed to improving upon and celebrating the strength of ALA and the National Associations of Librarians of Color. She just completed a 3-year term as an American Library Association Executive Board Member and 2-year term as Chair of the Steering Committee on Organizational Effectiveness (SCOE). Pelayo-Lozada also served on the Steering Committee of the Joint Conference of Librarians of Color in 2015-2018. She was a 2011 ALA Emerging Leader and has been influential in working on numerous ALA committees.
